Call to Order

The special meeting of the Seymour Library Board of Trustees Special Meeting was called to order at 6:38 pm on 6 October 2021 by Board President B. LoBracco.

Marketing

The Marketing Committee has prepared donation letters for area businesses and individuals. They anticipate a 20% response.

Proposed 2022 Budget

- S. Maar presented highlights of the (revised) proposed 2022 budget. Highlights include:
 - The revised budget is \$32K less than the proposed budget from August.
 - The revenue section has been adjusted to be \$8K higher.
 - The proposed budget is based on the 2020 census population.
 - Payroll expenses are about \$9K higher than last year, and is based on a 53-hour operating week.
 - Pages will be paid at the 2022 minimum wage (\$13.20 per hour).
 - The revised budget is based on two vacant librarian positions (adult and young adult librarians), as well as a clerk vacancy.
 - Clerks will be paid \$13.50 per hour.

Proposed 2022 Budget (continued)

- Starting on 1 January 2022, health and dental insurance benefits for all full-time employees will be offered only for the single option.
- Bullet aid expenses have been removed.
- Legal fee expenses have been reduced by 40%

S. Maar made a motion (with S. Rochette seconding) to raise the 2022 clerk salary from \$12.96 per hour to \$13.50 per hour instead of the 2022 minimum wage of \$13.20 per hour. The motion passed unanimously.

Adjournment

At 7:40 pm, S. Rochette made a motion (with K. Sharpe seconding) to adjourn. The motion passed unanimously.
